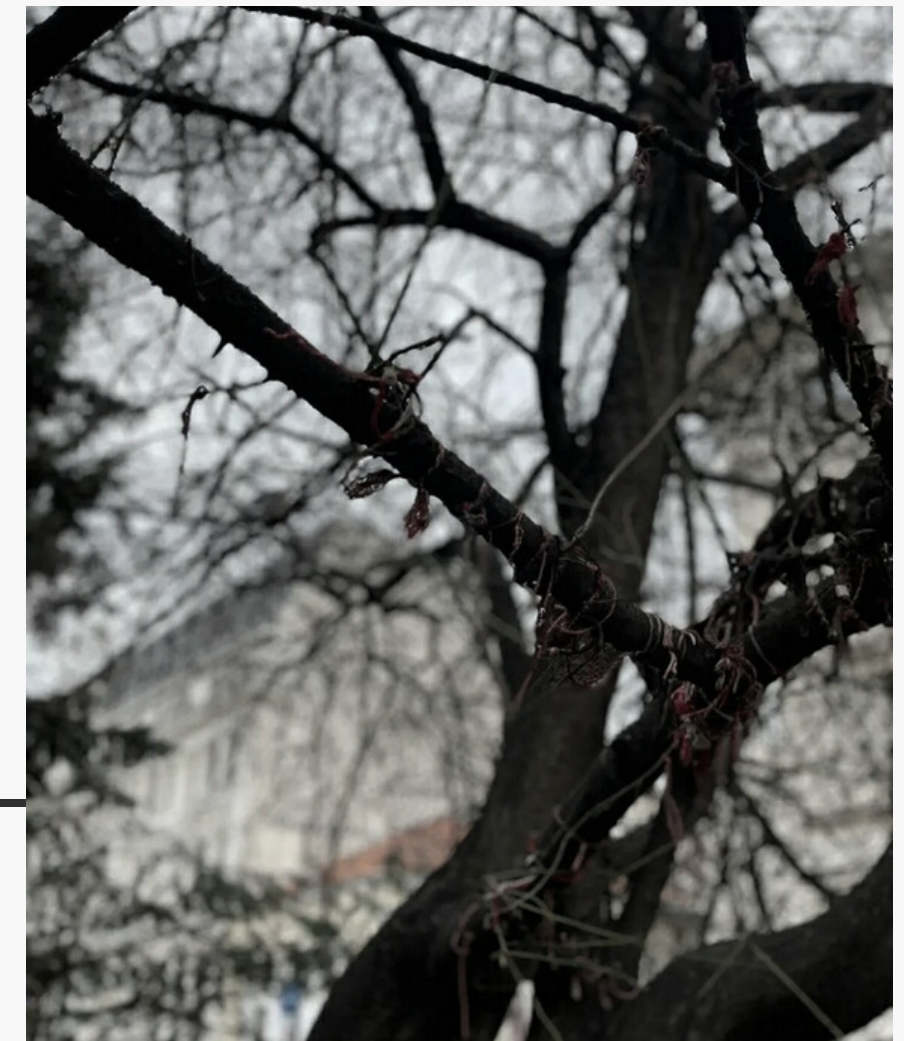


AMAZING RACE

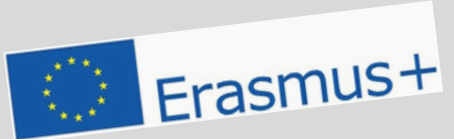
SPECIAL DAY
